Workforce readiness focus with academic, social and interpersonal supports fostering increased employment success. Program and service components include screening and intake, assessment of skills and needs, academic support, particularly academic tracking and drop out prevention, instruction leading to secondary school competition, mentoring and case management, asset and leadership development, skill-based career assessment and curriculum, and subsidized and unsubsidized work experiences, including internships and job shadowing.

- Those having academic difficulties will be provided access to a variety of resources including The Center for Youth's Web Café for computer based instruction, school based tutoring, counseling and crisis intervention, as well as job readiness experiences, employment placement (as appropriate) and career exploration opportunities.

Target Population:

- 175 students in Rochester and Monroe County
- Ages 16 and 17 years old
- Including East High, Franklin and Edison Educational Campus, School Without Walls and Spencerport High School, as well as a select few from BOCES.
- All youth will be attending school at the time of enrollment, must be WIA qualified and will possess multiple barriers to employment.

Hours of Operation:

Daily during school hours at school-based sites, aligned with The Center's Student Support Services initiatives at identified RCSD secondary schools.

- Assigned and present at school-based sites 4 days a week
- Training and computer skills building available until 9 pm on week-days.
- Work experiences may be provided during the weekends and school vacations—at school sites or at the Monroe Ave. office
