- Achieves program goals by performing other responsibilities as required.

1. Experience working with individuals who have developmental disabilities and autism is desirable. Ability to become CPR and first aid certified and meet agency required training. Sitting, standing, walking, lifting up to 50 pounds, pulling and pushing wheelchairs and adaptive equipment, carrying, grasping, reaching, stooping and crouching, and crawling may be required. 3. Must be able to read and write English to a level of fluency and comprehension which enables the candidate to follow written direction on labels, charts and other sources of client care and/or production information as well as follow, comprehend and appropriately act upon same if transmitted orally.
