## WORKFORCE PROGRAM SEEKS TO PREPARE 270 INDIVIDUALS FOR CAREERS IN MANUFACTURING WITH PRIMARY FOCUS ON ROCHESTER RESIDENTS

**Rochester, NY, June 27, 2023**—RochesterWorks and the Young Adults Manufacturing Training Employment Program (YAMTEP) today announced the launch of their ROCSEEDS workforce program that will connect 270 individuals, primarily City of Rochester residents, to direct employment over the next two years. Up to 70 of the program participants will be local high school students, with a pipeline to a manufacturing career upon graduation.

Growth of the ROCSEEDS program, which prepares Rochester residents for manufacturing jobs in a matter of weeks by providing them with basic manufacturing skills and work readiness training, is being supported by a \$862,000 grant from Empire State Development's (ESD) Office of Strategic Workforce Development.

**Executive Director of RochesterWorks, Dave Seeley said**, "RochesterWorks is excited to partner with YAMTEP and ESD on the ROCSEEDS program and be able to offer individuals from the City of Rochester the opportunity to prepare and train for jobs in the manufacturing sector. We are most appreciative of the funding awarded by the State for this program and feel this is a perfect example of how government can support innovative and effective workforce programs that help all members of our community to participate in our economy."

ROCSEEDS will utilize YAMTEP's successful training curriculum for entry level employment primarily in the manufacturing industry. This entry-level employment preparation program has proven to be one of the most effective of its kind in New York State for preparing at-risk populations, who are generally underrepresented in the workforce, for gainful employment. This includes those with experience in the criminal justice system, those impacted by gun violence, as well as those facing significant barriers to employment. The program will provide a subsidy for participants, helping to provide a bridge between enrollment and employment.

Through the ROCSEEDS partnership, RochesterWorks Youth Services Program will enroll participants and provide funding for supportive services such as equipment, childcare, and other basic needs as part of the process. The ROCSEEDS program will also utilize YAMTEP's transportation infrastructure which has already mitigated a considerable barrier to entry to the manufacturing sector for many job seekers. Upon successful completion of the program, most ROCSEEDS graduates will also be connected to their first employment opportunities.

Founded in 2015, YAMTEP provides basic training services individuals with little work experience and connects them with employers, primarily in the manufacturing sector. This includes basic job readiness and soft skills training, as well as basic occupational skills such as CNC Machinist training, forklift certification and other basic manufacturing fundamentals.

With the support of organizations like RochesterWorks, YAMTEP has successfully placed several hundred individuals into employment over the past several years. Its success is driven by the training platform, and also by the employer partners who continue to hire YAMTEP graduates.
