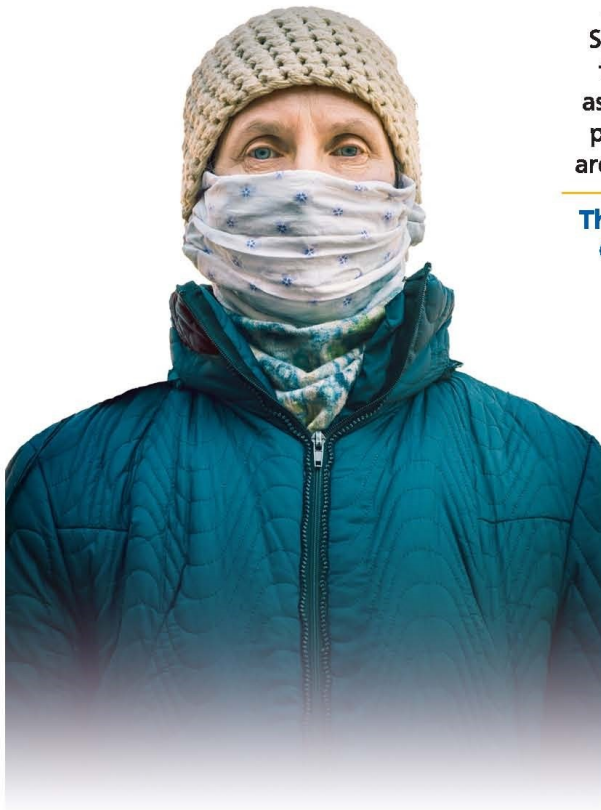

Rotary Clubs Can Help Their Own Communities!



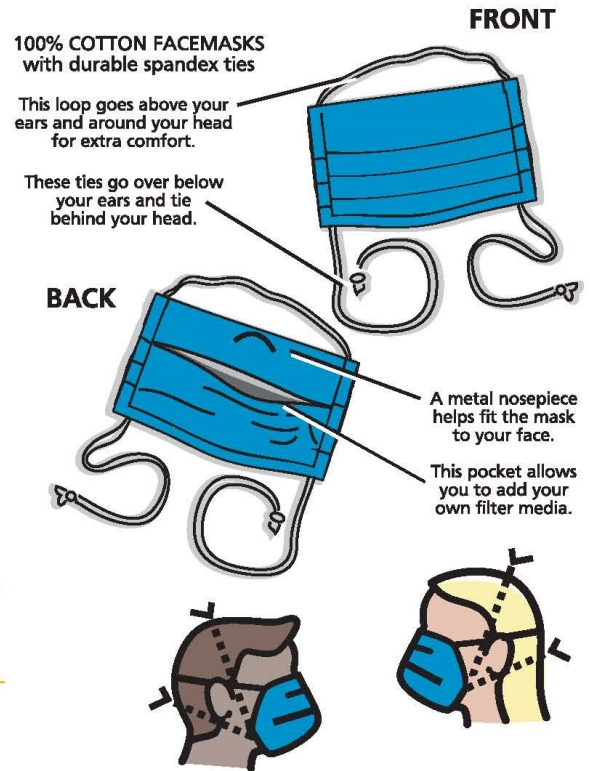
Through a grant from United Way & the Rochester Area Community Foundation, Rochester Refugee Sewing & Repair is able to offer cloth face masks to those who need them and don't have access such as Health Aides, Essential Service Workers, and other people who must be out in the public. Those masks are NOT Surgical Masks but do offer some protection.

This Grant allows for 6,000 FREE Masks to Rotary Clubs and their communities to be distributed primarily in Monroeville County.

You will be able to sterilize those masks and use them repeatedly as needed. While it is less than ideal, we want to do our best to protect many people during this pandemic. Those masks are not N-95 type and we cannot guarantee you will not get sick wearing it. This offers extra protection for our workers on the frontlines that do not have anything to prolong the life of their N-95's.
